Co-Director's Message

Frank Adams and friend were on the scene for the weekend and Dick & Mrs. Sharland stopped by on Saturday afternoon. Dick has been a regular member of the YANKEE Chapter since its inception. A most honored guest was Howard Wagner, one of our NATIONAL AMC of A Directors, from Omaha, Nebraska, who visited with us all day Saturday, meeting our members, checking out flea market buys and enjoying the evening meal [See "The ANTIQUÉ MOTORCYCLE, Vol. 30, No. 1, for story and color pictures of "Wagner's WAGNER". . . .Ed.]. Mr. Wagner was visiting his youngest son in Simsbury, Connecticut and is not exactly a stranger to YANKEEE-land, having previously participated in our WHITE MOUNTAIN NATIONAL ROAD RUN in 1986 [See p. 5, YANKEE CHATTER, No. 86-4 for Autumn for his story of this first YANKEE Chapter road run. . . .Ed.].

Our Treasurer, Fred Hirsch, signed up 20 new members, seven of whom also joined the NATIONAL AMC of A, and two of whom brought beautifully restored bikes, each of which garnered a trophy.

Now, looking ahead to our Bethlehem NATIONAL Meet on August 2-4, 1991, things are shaping up. Some of us plan to show up on Wednesday to get things organized.

"Rat" Scherk and Mike Hebert have also agreed to arrive on Wednesday, probably with the hope of scoring some early deals, but I think they'll have some stiff competition from the gate attendants. There will be plenty to do, and since we are the hosts of this event please feel free to volunteer your services for the good of your Chapter!

Next, I want to tell all of you about the generous donations our Chapter has received this year. First, with many, many thanks to our member "Nate" Sheldon and to Bob Frink, publisher of "The MOTORCYCLIST'S POST", for their efforts on our behalf, we have received a grant of \$ 3,000.00 from the New England Motorcycle Dealers' Association, Inc. That's right—THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS!! Their check was presented to Jim Costa and Fred Hirsch on Wednesday, June 5, 1991, on the premises of RUSS'S OCEAN STATE HARLEY-DAVIDSON, Inc., in Warwick, Rhode Island.

Secondly, the HARBOUR VINTAGE MOTOR Company (our own members "Rat" Scherk and Mike Hebert) has had our Club sign completely revamped with new numbers for the 1990's. It looks beautiful and is just in time for our 1991 NATIONAL Meet at Bethlehem.

Now, looking ahead to 1992 - which I can barely do now and which was even harder in February 1990 when it was necessary to start the ball rolling - we have a NATIONAL Road Run approved and scheduled for the first weekend in August. This activity will be based just north of White River Junction in Vermont—right in the heart of the Connecticut River Valley, allowing us to have one road run in the State of New Hampshire and one in the State of Vermont. 


